



BETTER ENERGY SCHOOL AWARDS 2020

The Better Energy School Awards aims to encourage environmental education in schools for children aged 5-11. To date, we have seen projects submitted by almost 350,000 young people, guided by their inspirational teachers.

The awards promote cross-curricular work on the environment and ANY work your school is doing on any kind of environmental issue can be entered.

The awards are split into four regions; South/Central, North, Wales and West Scotland. The winner of each region will be crowned 'Regional Champion,' and will then have the chance to become 'National Champion', receiving a total prize sum of £5,000 towards your school funds.

Competition Categories

Totally Clued Up: The Totally Clued Up category is for projects researching any aspect of the environment – can be incorporated into Geography, Science, Maths, I.T. and History e.g. wild bird feeding or recycling surveys

Totally Active: The Totally Active category is for projects involving work in the school grounds e.g. sensory gardens, ponds, wildlife areas, recycling schemes and composting.

Totally Scientific: For projects involving any aspect of Science, for example: Identifying plants and animals; studying living things and their habitats; carrying Also for projects with energy as a key component, for example creating solar powered models or comparing fossil fuels with renewable energies.

Totally Creative: Totally Creative is the category for environmentally themed art, music, drama and poetry. Examples include: save the planet song; pollution rap; art inspired by the environment; cleaner planet mural; recycled fashion show, junk orchestra.
